**JOSEPH FORCINA** serves as Chief of the new Hurricane Sandy Coastal Management Division for the North Atlantic Division. In this capacity, Mr. Forcina is responsible for oversight of the more than \$4 billion allocated to the North Atlantic Division's Hurricane Sandy Civil Works Program (PL 113-2).

Mr. Forcina began his career in 1982 as a Senior Structural Sciences Engineer with Grumman Aerospace Corporation in Bethpage, New York. In 1994, he joined the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers serving as a Civil Engineer with the New York District. Mr. Forcina held numerous positions during his 11-year tenure at NAN including Civil Engineer, Study Manager and Project Manager. From 1996 to 1998, Mr. Forcina was responsible for managing all phases of large- and small-scale investigations for the District involving coastal protective measures, flood control, environmental restoration and navigation projects. In 2005, Mr. Forcina came to the North Atlantic Division to serve as Program Manager for the Baltimore/Norfolk District Support Team. From 2009-2010, Mr. Forcina served as the Chief, Civil Works Integration Division for the North Atlantic Division.

Mr. Forcina has a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering from the New York Institute of Technology and a Master of Science in Civil Engineering and Engineering Mechanics from Columbia University. He is a graduate of the Senior Executive Fellows Program from Harvard University. Mr. Forcina is a Registered Professional Engineer in New York and a Registered Project Management Professional from the Project Management Institute.

Mr. Forcina is a member of the Order Sons of Italy in America and the Society of American Military Engineers. He has received numerous awards during his service with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers including the National Project Delivery Team of the Year Award in 2000 for outstanding work on the Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program Hazardous, Toxic and Radioactive Waste Program.
